

PARENT GOVERNOR VACANCIES 2025



We currently have one Parent Governor vacancy and a second position upcoming on our school's Governing Body. We are inviting applications from any parents who would like to take on this important and rewarding role.

Parent governors are welcomed as valued members of the team and play a vital role in ensuring the governing body is aware of the views of parents and the local community. We feel sure that there are parents prepared to take on this important role and give their time and commitment to helping us to continue to improve the school's performance. We very much hope that parents from all the many communities in the school would be interested in standing.

The Governing Body plays a vital part in the leadership of the school. Governors work closely with the Headteacher and senior leaders to help set the school's vision and strategic direction, monitor performance and ensure accountability. Being a governor is an excellent opportunity to contribute to the continued success of our school and take part in important decision making.

Who can apply? Anyone who has parental responsibility may stand for election as a staff governor, provided they are not disqualified under the school governance regulations. The term of office is typically four years, though you may step down earlier if your circumstances change.

The school office should receive all nominations by 3pm on Monday 24th November.

Ballot papers and election statements will then be sent home by pupil post on Weds 26th November.

The closing date for the return of ballot papers is Monday 8th December. They will be counted at 4pm on Thursday 11th December, and all candidates are invited to attend. The ballot is secret; you may send or post the ballot paper back in a sealed envelope addressed to the returning officer, or drop it into the secure ballot box in the school office by Thursday 11th December at 4pm.
