#### What parents should do to help keep kids safe online

- •Talk openly and regularly. Have honest, age-appropriate conversations with your child about what they do online which apps they use, who they chat with, what they watch or play. Encourage them to tell you if something makes them uncomfortable or worried.
- •Set rules and boundaries around internet use. Agree together on screen-time limits (when and how long they use devices), which apps/games are allowed, and when devices are or are not OK to use (e.g. not at bedtime, during meals).
- •Teach safe online behaviour. Help them understand not to share personal information (real name, address, school, phone number, photos) with strangers. Teach them that not everyone online is who they say they are, and that they should not meet people in real life whom they only met online.
- •Use technical protections. Use parental controls, content filters, safe-search settings and privacy settings on devices, games, social media and web-browsing.
- •Promote kindness, respect and digital citizenship. Remind children to treat others with respect online, avoid unkind language, and think before posting messages or comments as tone and intent can be misunderstood in written form. Stay involved and informed. Know which games, apps or websites your child uses and monitor their activity in a way that respects their trust while keeping them safe. Keeping up with new apps/trends helps you guide them better.

Our focus is **Appylying Past Knowledge to New Situations** – using what we learn!

Learning is not complete until we reflect on it and ask ourselves, "What have I learnt from this?"
