


Parent & Carers Survey January 2023


Q1. I have a child/ren


Q2. My child is happy at this school

Q3. My child feels safe at this school




Q4. My child makes good progress at this school

Q5. My child is well looked after at this school





- The only thing that I don't particularly like is that my youngest child who attends the 'X', leaves the class with their coat wide open, no jumper or hoodie underneath but the t-shirt, when the temperature outside is very low, windy and cold. I totally understand that you are trying to teach them to be independent and do things on their own, but if they forget, or they are not able to do certain things themselves, please make sure they are dressed appropriately and get help. It is upsetting for a parent to see their child in such conditions, especially when outside is freezing. Thanks!
- There have been several instances where our child didn't have play time because of disruptions made by other children. Our child feels that this is unfair and so do we.
- Their TAs and teacher are really caring and supportive.
- My only comment is that if something happens with another child I would like to know about it. Such as if that child had put their hand on another child to make that child go away.
- The staff are not caring enough
- You didn't realise when they first went in to class that they had not gone to the toilet for 2 weeks until I mentioned. When I did you didn't help enough and make them feel comfortable. Also they didn't eat any lunch as their placed on a table with other years and felt so uncomfortable and when I told u it

was suggested they sit with a teacher earlier with children less able to eat instead of just making them feel comfortable. I said they will try school dinners one day and no one showed them where to go or they had such anxiety about even holding the tray that they were going to drop it so that failed and is now not willing to have them. If someone helped them then this would be a different case

- The children are listened to looked after. I like that even when it can't agree with what they want, Like a football pitch or swimming pool! The headteacher listens and explains.
- They are looked after at the school. I do feel like there is something wrong and they are not saying
- Teachers don't give incident slips after injury at school. Extreme cold weather not taken into consideration when planning outdoor activities and P.E.
- The school works hard to make sure our concerns are listened to. I very care about the staff and they care for us to.

Q6. My child is taught well at this school



- They are getting there


Q7. My child receives appropriate homework for their age

- They get it with for their age but it is hard for them to do
- I do feel sometimes they give my autistic child homework that is too much for them. I talked to the teacher and let them know
- In the last 2 weeks my child has received too much homework and struggles to complete it
- White Rose maths sheets are not for homework. Also they spend enough time in school all week.

Q8. This school makes sure pupils are well behaved



- A few separate occasions I've been informed that a child/den have said not nice words to my children eg, swearing and were ignored when they reported it to the teacher.


Q9. This school deals effectively with bullying

- My child knows what to do and is listened to. It is difficult when some children don't tell the truth about everything and the parents might not listen to the school.


Q10 This school is well led and managed

- I think it is a hard time for everyone and for people who work in the school. I think the school is doing very well and help the community as much as they can. It is good to be part of a community that works together.


Q11. This school responds well to any concerns I raise

• Making or arranging contact with any of the teachers or headteacher can be difficult to begin with.


Q12. I receive valuable information from the school about my child's Progress

- We find it challenging to stay up to date with our child's progress especially receiving concrete answers to stuff our child struggles with. This can affect the school-home relationship.
- I am never updated about progress which I'd definitely like to be informed of quite often whether that be in a letter, on google classroom, email or in person that's entirely in the teacher or schools discretion. I am aware there are lots of pupils which is why I wouldn't expect these updates very often but I do think these updates would be useful either before half terms or any of the festive holidays such as Christmas, Easter and summer holidays. Not just parents evening. This will allow us to support our children at home accordingly.
- The adults see if I want to know something. It could improve by teachers and adults telling me more not just when at parent meeting. When they are older tell us as you go along so I can help at home.
- Unless my child hasn't hit expected targets, I've only ever been informed about progression at parents evening.
- Would love to receive more information through the Tapestry app and more regular/formal reviews from the key person, every month or so.
