Granary Square

1. Costume Design Mythology

Led by Pedro Resendez

Children will hear a mythological story and, after hearing the story, will create costumes out of paper to turn themselves into the characters they hear about.

The first step will be to nominate one or two children to trace around on large paper, and design costumes through collage.

Children will then work individually or small groups to make 3D paper garments.






2. Shapeshifting Buildings

Led by Amy Teh

This is a collage workshop where the pupils will create utopian buildings by cutting and sticking bits of paper.

There will be printouts of old buildings and characters which the children can redesign these buildings for.

After cutting and sticking we will turn these collages into hats to parade around the gallery and create our own city.





3. Identity in knots

Led by Ellie Cunningham (DBS)

Workshop schedule:

01. Introduction
What does identity mean to you?
How are you feeling? How you feel can affect
your identity....
Demonstration of how to knot fabric (show
preprepared examples)

O2. Draw
Try to picture how you feel...
Does it have a colour or shape? Does it have a texture? Is it messy, neat?
Close your eyes and try to draw this feeling...

03. Assemble

Using the prepared strips of fabric, tie pieces together to form a wibbly wobbly shape that represents the feelings you have drawn. Choose whichever fabrics that you like.

04. Arrange


Lay everyone's wobbly creations on the table next to one another.

Arrange the pieces by similarity or difference. Once a composition has been created, tie these pieces together.

Discussion around creations in terms of feelings/identity.

05. Hang

Hang up the collectively knotted wobbly piece in the window to display. Discussion around collective identity.



4. Puppet Making

Led by Holly Le Var (DBS) and Tracy Zeng

The Limbs Library / Shifty Creatures

Using puppet-making, abstract thinking and collaboration, participants will be discussing ideas around empathy and identity through the making of fabulously strange puppet creatures!

Workshop schedule:

- What are puppets? What is empathy? Discussion around topics.
- Making the puppets; selecting abstract puppet parts from the colourful limb library and constructing in pairs.
- Who is your puppet? Filling in a character worksheet, answering the questions: What is it's name? Where does it live? What is it's super power? How big or small is it? What sound does it make? How does it walk?
- Performing and photographing the puppets in the shadow theatre.
