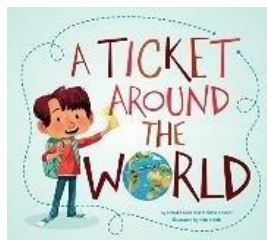


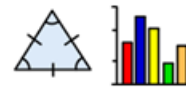
English / Reading / Phonics

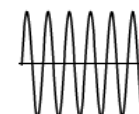

Science

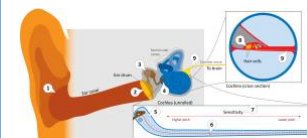
This term's Science learning will start with investigating sound. Children will learn about the ear, pitch and vibrations, along with how to investigate and evaluate data.
